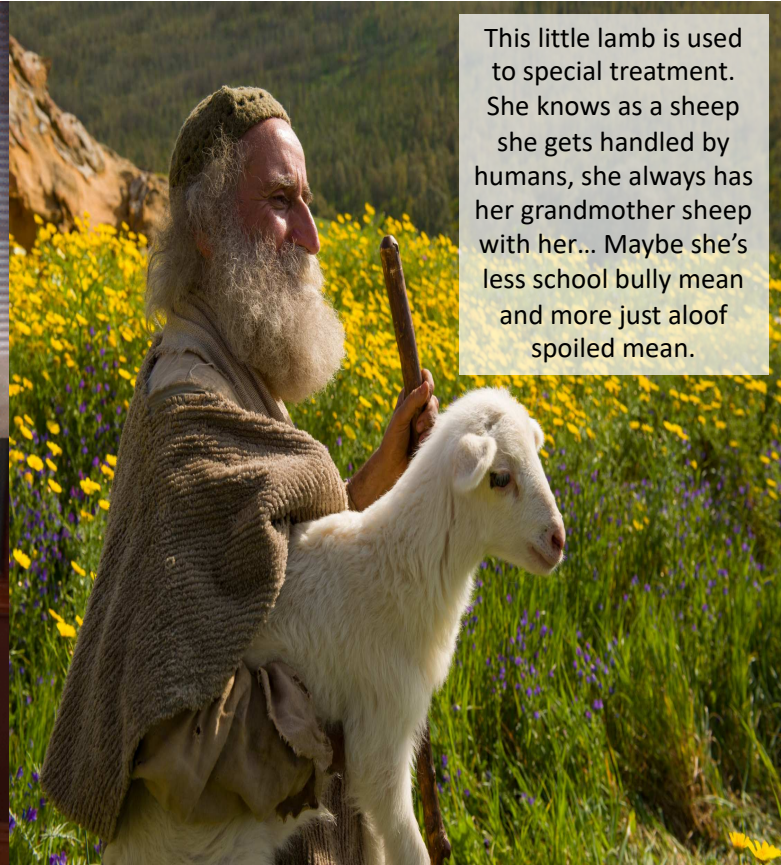
Lamb thinks she cool, and is a of a better species, but she's still an animal, just like Wilbur.
